ALL-CONFERENCE SELECTIONS







Women's Golf won its second straight and fourth overall Conference USA Championship in 2019 behind individual medalist Ana Gonzalez. UTSA also advanced to the NCAA postseason for the second consecutive year under the direction of Summer Batiste, who was named Conference USA Women's Golf Coach of the Year for the second time.



Men's Golf matched the best conference finish in program history after reaching the title match of the Conference USA Championship, where they dropped a close 3-2 decision to Middle Tennessee. Led by all-conference performer Sean Meehan, UTSA finished stroke play atop the team leaderboard and downed UAB by a 3-2 count in the semifinals of match play.



Track & Field captured five individual conference titles — Luca Chatham (indoor mile), Gary Haasbroek (heptathlon, decathlon), Danielle Spence (indoor triple jump) and Gabriyella Torres (pentathlon).



Under the direction of 2018 Conference USA Coach of the Year Steve Henson, Men's Basketball tied for second place in the final league standings, the program's best league finish since 2005. Jhivvan Jackson and Keaton Wallace finished the season as the highest-scoring backcourt duo in the nation, and both players were named All-Conference USA and NABC All-District.

Volleyball posted a runner-up finish in Conference USA, highlighted by standout outside hitter Kirby Smith earning C-USA Freshman of the Year accolades. Coach Laura Neugebauer-Groff posted her 300th career win at the helm of the Roadrunners during the campaign.





Three Track & Field athletes combined to earn four All-America certificates, as Danielle Spence garnered second-team All-America honors in the NCAA Indoor triple jump, Gary Haasbroek was a second-team honoree in the NCAA Indoor heptathlon and an honorable mention selection in the NCAA Outdoor decathlon and Luca Chatham earned honorable mention honors in the NCAA Outdoor 800 meters.

UTSA drew 42,071 fans for its home football game against Baylor on Sept. 8 at the Alamodome. That marked the second-largest home crowd in program history and it was the most fans for a home game in Conference USA during the 2018 season. UTSA also led C-USA in average home attendance (24,710) in 2018.

2018-19 UTSA ATTENDANCE HIGHLIGHTS

UTSA LED CONFERENCE USA in average home attendance for football (24,710).

The Roadrunners drew the SECOND-LARGEST HOME CROWD in FOOTBALL PROGRAM HISTORY and the LARGEST HOME CROWD by any Conference USA school in 2018 when 42,071 fans watched the home opener against Baylor on Sept. 8 at the Alamodome.

The volleyball program recorded the SECOND-HIGHEST HOME ATTENDANCE average and SECOND-BEST SALES numbers in program history. The Roadrunners also drew more than 1,000 FANS to two home matches during the 2018 season.

The men's basketball program sold the MOST SEASON TICKETS and SINGLE GAME TICKETS in more than 10 years. The Roadrunners drew their LARGEST HOME CROWD in more than eight years for the Nov. 12 contest against Oklahoma.

The softball program had THREE SELLOUTS during the 2019 season and GROUP SALES INCREASED by 23 percent from the previous year.

The baseball program drew more than 10,000 FANS in 2019 and GROUP SALES INCREASED by 30 percent from the previous year.
