San Diego State vs. Nevada Postgame Notes

Lawlor Events Center | Reno, Nev.

January 25, 2025

Big Notes

- **Magoon Gwath** is the second Aztec since at least the 1996-97 season to record a double double (15 pts/13 rebs) with a perfect shooting night (7-of-7) joining Roy Kruiswyk who was (6-of-6) in a 13 pt/10 reb double double against SMU on Jan. 15, 1998.
- **Magoon Gwath** with two blocks versus Nevada has 45 this season and moved into a tie for No. 2 on the program's freshman blocked shots list, equaling Leonard Allen's total from 1982.
- **Miles Byrd** is the first Aztec since at least 1996-97 with nine assists, three steals and a block in a game.
- San Diego State held the Wolf Pack to 50 points, matching the fewest points in a game this season against a Division I opponent (also: California on Dec. 21, 2024)
- SDSU's 19-point win was its third largest against Nevada since at least the 1996-97 season and the second largest margin in Reno, trailing only a 21-point win (78-57) on Jan. 23, 2013.
- San Diego State is now 98-7 under Brian Dutcher and has won 32 straight when it holds its opponent to less than 60 points.

Series Notes

- San Diego State improves to 27-8 (.771) all-time against Nevada.
- In the Mountain West era (since the start of the 1999-00 season) SDSU is now 22-5 against the Wolf Pack but is just 6-6 in its last 12 games at Lawlor Events Center.
- Head coach Brian Dutcher's record against Nevada improves to 14-4 which includes a 3-4 mark at Lawlor Events Center.
- San Diego State is 13-2 in its last 15 games against Nevada, regardless of location, including 3-2 in its last five in Reno.

- San Diego State's 19-point margin of victory was nearly three times higher than its average in its previous four wins in Reno (6.8 pts) since the Wolf Pack joined the Mountain West conference.

Team Notes

- In road games, the Aztecs are now:
 - 49-32 under Brian Dutcher
 - 68-38 (.642) versus Mountain West teams since the start of the 2013-14 season, when the current slate of teams came together.
 - 101-52 (.660) in its last 153 against unranked opponents, including a 47-29 mark (.618) under Brian Dutcher.
 - 26-8 (.765) versus Mountain West teams from the state of Nevada (Nevada and UNLV) since Brian Dutcher took control of the program at the start of the 2017-18 season.
- San Diego State moves to 108-50 in its last 158 games played on Saturday including 54-26 under Brian Dutcher.
- In games played in the month of January, the Aztecs are now 44-19 under Brian Dutcher and as a program has won 88 of their last 118 (88-30) January tilts.
- SDSU moves to 12-1 this season, 169-17 under Brian Dutcher and 232-25 in its last 257 games when it takes a lead into the intermission.
- When San Diego State scores the first points of a game, it is 123-26 in the Brian Dutcher era and 241-22 in its last 303 games.
- The Aztecs, for the 11th time this season, the 167th time in the last 179 games (167-12) under Brian Dutcher, and 423rd of the last 439 (423-16), won a contest in which they led with five minutes to play.
- SDSU moves to 4-4 this season, 43-46 under Brian Dutcher and 83-76 in the last 159 games in games in which it lost the rebound battle.
- The Aztecs attempted fewer free throws than their opponent, but moved to 8-4 this year, 62-47 under Brian Dutcher and 105-78 in its last 183 in games in which its opponent took more foul shots.
- San Diego State has made at least one 3-pointer in 318 consecutive games. The last time the Aztecs finished a game without a triple was in the championship game of the Continental Tire Las Vegas Invitational against West Virginia on November 27, 2015, a total of 3,347 days.
- SDSU is now 48-29 under Brian Dutcher and 104-52 in its last 156 games when it totals between 60-69 points.
- The Aztecs move to 5-0 this year, 71-5 under Brian Dutcher, has won 25 straight when limiting its opponent to between 50-59 points.
- San Diego State moved to 22-0 under Brian Dutcher when it has recorded at least 21 assists in a game.

Game Flow

- **Lead Changes: 2 | Ties: 1**
- San Diego State won the tip Magoon Gwath to Jared Coleman-Jones.
- San Diego State's BJ Davis scored the first points of the game, a 3-pointers, at 19:46.

- SDSU committed three personal fouls in the first three minutes of the game and then committed only three more over the final 17 minutes of the half.
- The Aztecs opened the game with a 5-0 run but then saw Nevada score 11 straight points over 6:10 to take an 11-5 lead with 12:05 to play before the intermission.
- San Diego State was trailing 7-13 at the 10:58 mark and then went on an 13-0 run over 4:14 to move in front 20-13 with 8:06 to play in the half. Taj DeGourville had five of SDSU's 13 points in the run.
- In the first half, Miles Byrd and Nick Boyd combined to go 2-of-11 from the field, but the rest of the roster was 9-of-16.
- San Diego State took its biggest lead to that point, 10 points at 31-21, on a 3-pointer at 18:17.
- To open the second half, SDSU committed four personal fouls in the first four minutes and Nevada was in the bonus with 12:34 left in regulation.

Player Notes

Magoon Gwath – 15 points, 7-of-7 FG, 1-of-1 3PFG, 13 rebounds, 2 blocks, 1 steal

Scored in double figures 5th time this year ... Recorded his second double double of the season ... Grabbed a career-high in rebounds ... Reached multiple blocks for the 12th game this season and in those games SDSU is 9-3 ... Led the team in points for the third time this season ... Paced the squad in rebounds for the sixth time in his college career ... Moved into a tie for No. 2 on the program's freshman blocks list (45 total for the season).

Taj Degourville – 14 points, 5-of-6 FG, 4-of-4 3PFG, 2-of-2 FT, 3 assists, 1 rebounds

Reached double figure scoring for the second straight game and 4th time in his career (SDSU is 4-0) ... Matched a single game high and established a game best against a Division I opponent ... Matched season-highs with five field

goals and four three-pointers ... His four triples are the most he's had in a Division I contest ... Knocked down five buckets for the third time this season ... Played a single game high in minutes (27:22) ... Enjoyed his 14th game this year with one or fewer turnovers.

Miles Byrd – 11 points, 4 rebounds, 9 assists, 3 steals, 1 block

Established a new career-high and led the team in assists ... Becomes the sixth Aztec to have a game of at least 9 assists since Brian Dutcher took control of the program in the 2017-18 season ... Scored in double figures for the 13th time this season (SDSU is 9-4) and 15th time in his college career (SDSU is 9-6) ... Led the team in assists for the third time this season and fifth of his career.
